Become a Registered Family Child Care Provider





As an unlicensed child care provider, you cannot provide care to more than three children from more than one family at any given time. This does not include your own children.

Once you have a Registered Family (RF) child care license issued by the Office of Child Care (OCC), you may care for up to 10 children at any given time.

- Six of the ten children may be preschool age or younger (not yet eligible for Kindergarten)
- Two of the children may be under the age of two
- This does include your own children who are 12 or under

- Have all residents of the home, 18 and older, complete a background check through the OCC; to enroll
 in the Central Background Registry (CBR) go online to www.oregonearlylearning.com and click on
 Central Background Registry
- 4. Have your water tested for lead by an approved lab
- 5. Send in your Registered Family application and fee (you will get this at the part 2 training)
- 6. Schedule a Health and Safety Review with your Licensing Specialist when they call

Important: You are not a licensed provider until after you have completed all the above steps and a licensing specialist has issued you a license number at the health and safety review of your home. Your license must be approved **before** you can care for more than three children at one time.
