Developing Language and Literacy Skills

A language rich environment that engages children in lots of talking, reading and singing can enhance the development of language and literacy skills in young children. Through personal interactions and play opportunities, children expand their language and literacy skills.

Cultivating Early Math Skills

Cultivating Mathematical thinking in young children allows them to explore and understand the components of Mathematics; geometry and spatial awareness, numbers and operations, measurement, data collection and analysis, and patterns.

Developing Social Emotional Competence

Children who are socially and emotionally ready for school are confident, able to develop good relationships with peers, can concentrate on tasks, listen, remain attentive, and communicate feelings effectively.

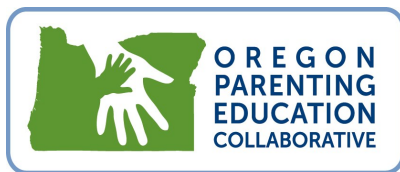
