Is your non-profit following volunteer screening best practices?

- ⇒ Experts estimate that 94-98 % of child sexual predators have clean background checks.
- ⇒ Peak vulnerability for boys and girls are ages 7 to 13.
- ⇒ One study of 4,000 abusers found 20% reported they had their first victim before they were 10, another 43% began to molest between the ages of 10 to 15, and 76% said they began to molest before age 20.

IYS has found that less than 11% of youth programs use best practices to protect youth. *Improve the statistics – join us!*
